She spent most of her childhood on Whidbey Island, Washington, and attended an oral mainstream program in Seattle. As a profoundly deaf child, Heidi became the youngest recipient in the U.S. to receive a cochlear implant. During college, she became immersed in Deaf community and acquired ASL. It was a life changing experience that shaped her career path. With a bachelor's degree from the University of Washington, and a graduate degree from Lewis and Clark College, Heidi has been teaching Deaf and Hard of Hearing students in mainstream public schools in Washington and Oregon for the past twenty years. She is proactively involved in advancing the effectiveness of mainstream education and is actively involved in efforts to pass the LEAD-K bill in Oregon. She also serves as a member of the Advisory Board for Western Oregon University's Deaf and Hard of Hearing Teacher Education program.
