

Jeffrey S. Bravin has been employed at the American School for the Deaf (ASD) in West Hartford, CT since 2002. He is currently the Executive Director responsible for oversight of the school, reporting directly to the Board of Directors. He is responsible for carrying out the vision, mission and goals of ASD including overseeing education/program development, admissions, human resources, finance, outreach, faculty development, public relations and institutional advancement. Prior to assuming this role, Mr. Bravin served as the Assistant Executive Director/Chief Operating Officer of the school. Prior to that he was the Director of Special Projects which focused on construction of ASD's new Gallaudet-Clerc Education Center and managing ASD's PrintWorks, alumni relations as well as several other ASD departments and activities. Previously, Mr. Bravin was employed at the Lexington School for the Deaf in Jackson Heights, NY as their High School Social Studies Teacher, Deaf Resource Center Specialist and as their Associate Director of Development and External Affairs in his final three years. He was recently invited to serve on the CT Governor's Advisory Board for Persons Who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing. He also serves on the Board of the Conference of Educational Administrators of Schools and Programs for the Deaf (CEASD); the Board of the American Society of Deaf Children (ASDC); the Connecticut Council on Organizations Serving the Deaf (CCOSD); and the Coalition of Private Schools for Deaf Children (COPSDC). He was formerly on the Board of Directors for the National Theatre of the Deaf (NTD).
